SYNOPSIS

• A sentence is a group of words that conveys complete sense.

• Sentences are of four kinds:

DECLARATIVE SENTENCES : These Sentences declare a fact , a plan or an argument

and always ends with a full stop.

INTERROGATIVE SENTENCES: These Sentences ask a question and ends with a question mark.

IMPERATIVE SENTENCES: These Sentences express a command , make a request or give advice and ends with a full stop.

EXCLAMATORY SENTENCES: These Sentences express a strong or sudden feeling and ends with an exclamation mark.

• Full Stops , question marks and exclamation marks are called end punctuation marks.

• A Sentence that has NOT in it is called a Negative Sentence.
