- A sentence can be divided into two parts Subject and Predicate.
- That part of the sentence which names what the sentence is about is the <u>SUBJECT</u>.
- That part of the sentence which says something about the subject is the PREDICATE.
- In Interrogative sentences, the subject comes after the verb.
- In Imperative sentences, the subject is implied.
- In Exclamatory sentences the subject comes before the verb.
- In sentences which begin with there or here ,the subject comes after the verb.
