**SYNOPSIS**

- *A sentence can be divided into two parts – **Subject and Predicate**.*
- *That part of the sentence which names what the sentence is about is the **SUBJECT**.*
- *That part of the sentence which says something about the subject is the **PREDICATE**.*
- *In Interrogative sentences, the subject comes after the verb.*
- *In Imperative sentences, the subject is implied.*
- *In Exclamatory sentences the subject comes before the verb.*
- *In sentences which begin with there or here ,the subject comes after the verb.*
