TOPIC: PRONOUNS

SYNOPSIS

A Pronoun is used in place of a Noun or a phrase that contains a Noun.

Pronouns are of 8 kinds:

- 1. Personal Pronouns are the pronouns that are associated primarily with a particular person. Eg: I, we, her, them, etc.
- 2. Demonstrative Pronouns are words that are used to indicate or point at something or someone. Eg: This, that, these, those, etc.
- 3. Possessive Pronouns indicate possession or belonging. Eg: Mine, hers, yours, his, etc.
- 4. Interrogative Pronouns are those that are used to ask questions. Eg: What, who, which, whom, etc.
- 5. Emphatic Pronouns refers back to another Noun or Pronoun in the sentence to emphasize it. Eg: Herself, itself, themselves, ourselves, etc.
- 6. Reflective Pronouns are pronouns that are used when the subject and the object are the same. They are always used as an object to a verb or a preposition. Eg: Himself, myself, etc.
- 7. Reciprocal Pronouns are used to show that an action or a feeling is reciprocated. Eg: Each other, one another, etc.
- 8. Indefinite Pronouns are those which do not refer to any specific person, thing or amount. Eg: Everybody, someone, no one, anywhere, etc.
