A home of a bird is called a nest.

Birds build nests mainly to lay their eggs in them.

Birds build nests in different places like on a tree, in ventilators, corners of walls, in hedges and bushes, in the barks of trees and in the ground.

Birds use different kinds of materials to build their nests such as leaves, grass, mud, feathers, twigs, hair, stones and cotton.

They build their nests in safe places to protect their nests from their enemies. Birds work very hard to build their nests.

Birds take good care of their young ones. The parent birds take turns to sit on the eggs until they hatch.

Once the baby birds hatch out of the eggs, they are weak, helpless, have no feathers and they cannot see or fly. The parent birds feed them and teach them how to fly till they are old enough to fly on their own. We should never disturb the nest of a bird.
