SYNOPSIS

The person or the animal doing the action in a sentence is called the subject of the sentence.

A subject usually comes at the beginning of a sentence.

The part of the sentence. that explains or describes the subject or tells us what the subject does or is doing is called the Predicate.

Every complete sentence contains two parts a subject and a Predicate.

The subject is what (or whom) the sentence is about, while the Predicate tells something about the subject.

>Example the dog ran.

The dog is the subject of the sentence.

ran is the Predicate of sentence...
