The things and places that are built and maintained by the government are called public property. Eg. schools, parks, hospitals and so on.

We should take good care of our public and private property.

- we must not damage school furniture.
- we must not tear off pages from the books of our school library.

It is our civic duty to respect and care for both the public and private property.
