B. Distinguish between:

1. Civics and Civic Sense

Civics is a study of how a government works, the responsibilities of a government, the responsibilities of the people who live in a country and the rights and duties of the people of a country. The term civic sense is made up of two words civics and sense. Civic means relating to a city or town. It tells us about the duties of people toward the city or town. Sense means to be aware of something so civic sense means being aware of our rights and duties as a citizen of a country.

2. Public property and private property

The things and places that are owned by a family are called private property eg. house, bicycle , car and so on . The things and properties that are built and maintained by the government are called public property eg. parks, schools , hospitals ,roads and so on.

1. A citizen is a person who belongs to a country and enjoys certain rights. A good citizen is one who respects other citizens, participates in the running of the country, obeys rules and fulfills his or her duties and to love one's country. The two responsibilities of a good citizen are to obey rules, to respect national symbols such as our national flag and national anthem.
