### **TOPIC: NUMBER**

## **SYNOPSIS:-**

There are two Numbers in English-

- 1) The Singular
- 2) The Plural

A noun that stands for one person, place, animal or thing is said to be in the **singular number.** For example, a school, a child, a toothbrush, a comb, blanket.

A noun that stands for more than one person, place, animal or thing is said to be in the **plural number.** For example, schools, children, toothbrushes, combs, blankets.

Nouns that can be counted are called **countable nouns.** For example, pencil, door.

Nouns that cannot be counted are called **uncountable nouns**. For example, **a glass of** milk, **a bottle of** jam.
