- 7. The Postal Service: Scholars believe that the first postal service began in ancient Persia (present day Iran). The ancient Romans perfected the Postal system, the Postal system was modernized during the nineteenth century.
- 8. Inventions in Communication:-
 - **PRINTING PRESS**: The Chinese were the first to develop the art of printing, Johannes Gutenberg invented the printing press in the fifteenth century, Gutenberg's printing press made it possible to make more copies in lesser time and at a much lower cost, the Bible was the first book to be printed.
 - •THE TELEGRAPH: It was invented by Samuel Morse between 1830's and 1840's. Messages were sent in a coded language of dots and dashes called the Morse code.
 - **THE TELEPHONE:** It was invented by Alexander Graham Bell in 1876. It became the fastest means of communication. In recent times mobile phones have become a more popular device of communication.
 - **THE RADIO:** It was invented by Guglielmo in the late nineteenth century. It was a popular source of entertainment and news.
 - **THE TELEVISION:** It was invented by John Logie Baird in the beginning of the twentieth century. It became the most powerful tools of communication in the world. It is a source of education and entertainment.
 - **COMPUTER AND INTERNET:** Earlier computers were huge machines but today they are sleek devices. Internet came into being in the twentieth century. It created a global system of interconnected computers. The internet today is used for a variety of purposes. It has made communication faster and cheaper.
 - **SATELLITES**: They receive signals from the earth and then transmits them back. Satellites are placed above the earth's surface. It has made it possible to connect people and places to any

part of the world. It helps to watch live coverage of musical performances, cricket matches, make phone calls and forecasting of weather.
