


1. Work for Revision

- c) For more revision some work has been given at the end of this worksheet.


2. Learning to write letters of the alphabet: Gems English Reader: Follow pg-13





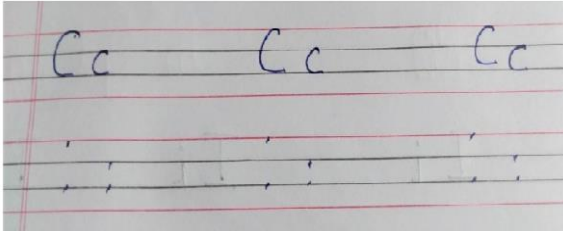

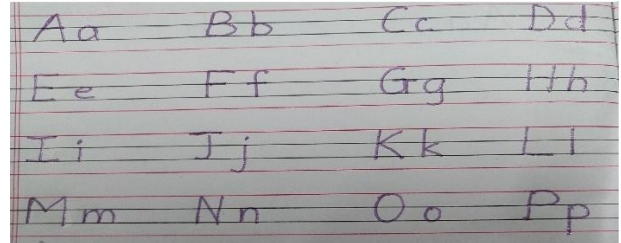
Practice these letters of the alphabet i.e. M, N, O, P in the Gems English Reader Pages 21, 22 and 23.
