Recapitulation:

- 1. There are 26 letters in the English Language.
- 2. There are 5 vowels.

 Letters a, e, i, o, u are called vowels.
- 3. All letters other than vowels are called consonants.
- 4. A vowel is a sound that is created without blocking any sound.
- 5. When it is a single letter a, e, i, o, u, they are called short vowels.
- 6. The words having the vowels a , e , I , o , u are as follows:
- a ant, apple, arm.
- e − egg, eye, ear.
- i ice, ink, igloo.
- o orange, owl, onion.
- u under, urn, umbrella.
- 7. Every word that we are learning to read and write has a vowel. Example go, come, in, eat, song.
- 8. Example In the word cat, here 'a' is a vowel. c and t are consonants.
- 9. We use 'an' before words that begin with a vowel (a, e, I, o, u) and we use 'a' before words that begin with a consonant.


10.Examples:
