TOPIC – Calendar (Days, Weeks, Months and Years)

---

## (SYNOPSIS)

- A day starts at Midnight (12 O'clock at night) and ends next Midnight.
  - There are seven different days.( Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday)
  - There are seven days in a week.
  - There are twelve months. Each month is divided into weeks. Each has a different name. (January, February, March, April, May, June, July, August, September, October, November and December)
  - A month is about 30 days long that is about 4 weeks and a few more days.
  - Some months can be longer or shorter.
  - A year has 12 months or 365 days. It is a long period of time. For example- from one birthday to the next birthday.
  - Every four years February has 29 days instead of 28 days. So, there are 366 days in the year. This is called a leap year. For example- year 2020 is a leap year.
