SYNOPSIS:

Words that help in joining words or sentences are called **joining words**. Joining words can also be known as **Conjunctions**.

Some of the commonly used joining words are and, but, or, because.

 And – The word and is used to join words and sentences with similar ideas or to add information.

> <u>For Example</u> – It is a sunny day. It is hot. It is a sunny day <u>and</u> it is hot.

<u>But</u> – The word **but** is used to join words and sentences to show a difference or an opposite idea.

<u>For Example</u> – The sky is cloudy. It is not raining.

The sky is cloudy <u>but</u> it is not raining.

• <u>Or</u> – The word **or** is used to show a choice between two or more options.

<u>For Example</u> – Do you want coffee? Do you want tea? Do you want coffee **or** tea?

• <u>Because</u> – The word **because** is used to explain the cause or reason for an action.

<u>For Example</u> – Annie gets up early. She goes to bed early.

Annie gets up early <u>because</u> she goes to bed early.
