Q1. Answer the following questions:

- a) A mountain is a very high land mass with sloping sides and peaks.
E.g. Mount Everest.
- b) Hills and mountains that are lower in height. E.g. Aravalli Hills/ Nilgiri Hills.
- c) Peninsula is a land which is surrounded by seas and oceans on three sides.
- d) A land which is higher than the surrounding area of land but has a flat surface. E.g. Deccan Plateau.
- e) A dry sandy land is called a desert. E.g. Thar Desert.
- f) The Arabian Sea on the west, the Bay of Bengal on the east and the Indian ocean to the south.
- g) An island is a piece of land surrounded by water on all the sides.
E.g. Lakshadweep Islands / Andaman and Nicobar Islands.
