SUMMARY OF THE CHAPTER:-

Pre-Islamic Arabia was divided into tribes that were at war with each other. People worshiped many gods and goddesses.

Mecca was an important city as it was a major junction of trade routes and an important religious center. Kaaba, a pilgrimage shrine served as a central place of worship for many different Arab tribes and is located in Mecca.

Prophet Muhammad was born in Mecca in 570 CE. He grew up to be a trader. At the age of 40, he had a vision, wherein God had chosen him to be the messenger of the divine message.

In 622 CE, Prophet Muhammad left Mecca and went to Medina. This is known as Hijrat. The people of Medina welcomed Muhammad and accepted him as their Prophet. After a few years, Muhammad defeated the army of Meca and made Kaaba the main shrine of Islam. Gradually Islam spread to the whole of Arabia and to Europe aswell.

His five main principles were Shahada, Salat, Sawm, Zakat and Haj. He believed that all men were equal and that there is only one God.

Abu Bakr, Umar, Usman and Ali were Caliph who succeeded Muhammad and ruled from 632 CE to 661 CE. Thereafter the Umayyids ruled from 661 CE to 750 CE. In 750 CE, the Umayyids were overthrown by the Abbasids. Harun al Rashid was a famous ruler of this dynasty. This was a period of cultural growth. The Abbasids ruled for more than 500 years, and were overthrown by the Mongols, who captured Baghdad and ended the Abbasid rule. This led to the Ottoman empire.

The Arabs made a number of achievements and contributions in the field of mathematics, astronomy, chemistry, literature, art and architecture.
