SUBJECT AND PREDICATE SYNOPSIS:

Every complete sentence contains two parts: a subject and a predicate. The subject is what (or whom) the sentence is about, while the predicate tells us something about the subject. In the following sentences, the predicate is enclosed in braces ({}}).

Judy {runs}.

Judy and her dog {run on the beach every morning}.

Kinds of subject

- 1. A subject can be a single word noun or pronoun.
- 2. A subject can be a phrase containing nouns, articles or modifiers.
- 3. A subject can be to or more nouns, pronouns or phrases that may be joined by a conjunction.

Spotting the Subject

Let us learn to identify subjects in different kinds of sentence:

- 1. Declarative sentence- in declarative sentence the subject appears before the verb
- 2. Interrogative sentence- with one verb, the subject appears after the verb. In interrogative sentence with two verbs the subject appears between the two verbs.
- 3. Imperative sentence- in imperative sentence the subject you is implied.
- 4. Exclamatory sentence- subject usually comes before the verb.

Kinds of predicate

- 1. A predicate can just be a single verb.
- 2. A predicate can be a phrase containing a verb in some tense person and number.
- 3. When the verb is an intransitive verb, the predicate can be a verb and its modifier or compliment.
- 4. When the verb is transitive the predicate can be a verb and its object.
- 5. When the verb is a transitive verb with two object the predicate consists of verb and its object, direct object and indirect object
- 6. A predicate can be to or more verbs or phrases that can be joined by conjunction
