Synopsis

Words that describe nouns are called adjectives.

There are five kinds of adjective.

1. adjectives that tell us about the quality of nouns are called adjectives of quality.
2. Adjectives that tell us the quantity of nouns are called adjectives of quantity
3. adjectives that tell us the exact number of nouns for their position in a series called adjectives of number
4. Adjectives that show position are called possessive adjectives
5. Adjectives that points at specific things are called demonstrative adjectives.

By changing the form adjectives can be used to show comparison between two or more people, animal or things. These different forms of adjectives are called degrees of comparison.
