COMPARISON OF ADJECTIVES

- Adjectives are describing words which also help us to compare people and things. For e.g. Shayan is taller than Manish.
- There are three degrees of comparison. They are:
  - a) Positive Degree – It helps us to compare people and things. It is the simple form of the adjective. E.g. The box is heavy.
  - b) Comparative Degree – It is used to compare two people or things. We add -er to the simple form of adjectives to change them into the comparative form. The comparative degree is always followed by the word than in a sentence. E.g. This box is heavier than that box.
  - c) Superlative Degree - it is used to compare three or more people or things. We usually add -est to the simple form of the adjectives to change them into the superlative degree. The superlative degree always has the word the before it. E.g. This box is the heaviest of all these boxes.
- Some adjectives do not take er and est for making comparisons. Adjectives with three or more syllable take more to form the comparative and most to form the superlative. E.g. more important, most important.
- Some adjectives change their form completely while forming the comparatives and the superlatives. E.g. good, better, best
